

The Christian C. Sanderson Museum – A Man's Life, A Nation's History



Chris Sanderson for many years was the local "historian" of Chadds Ford, Pa. By the time he passed away at the age of 84 in 1966, he'd managed to collect over 18,000 artifacts and relics from days gone by- important mementos, autographs, military memorabilia, paintings, posters and other items from the Revolutionary War, Civil War, World Wars I and II, all the way up through the 1960s. Sanderson was good friends with the three

generations of the famous Wyeth family- N.C., Andrew and Jamie, along with many other artists, statesmen and celebrities. The museum bearing his name is the work of many people, notably Tom Thompson and Andrew Wyeth; it was dedicated in 1967. This undiscovered "gem" awaits visitors to Chadds Ford.
